Dr Harry Little Kinder tunnels dig for Dale 28 3 2021


G'day Dale



The actual address is obviously 243A. I've had this before when looking up certain locations. Misdirection can throw people off if they are looking for the sort of things that we are seeking. Or it could just be a genuine mistake. But it seems an odd one to make when you consider stressed out



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

A LITTLE HISTORY

Dr Harry little was a Bendigo GP in the 1960's. Our Preschool was built on the land left in a trust by his sisters and opened in October 1973. By 2010 there was a shortage of Preschool places for children in Bendigo so the Committee of Management opened a second room by utilising the space previously occupied by Noah's Ark toy library. We are now able to accommodate and educate 88 kindergarten children and 40 (3yr old) Prekinder children.


As we are not run by, or are on council land, we rely on the support of our families to maintain our building and playground.

The kinder is not government owned. And the property has been kept in the family. This is common with properties that have an underground. Which is a shame because with many places you can check real estate sales history and see the layout of the building in detail including easements.



From your friends message that you shared with me:

Tunnel at CCB — little tunnels under Dr Harry Little Kinder: 'he said they came in from the street at the back of the kinder and he reckons theres a little building thing at the back and he had to climb in thru a window thing and theres a tunnel with little rooms coming off the main tunnel he said it came out at the front of the kinder where the bins are kept. Also behind Hume and Iser theres a grate that opens up and you can go down a couple of hundred metres underneath isers into a bigger room and see out another grate on the roof that is he thinks out the front of isers..'



Forest Lane directly behind 243a View St has some weird property shape anomalies. Number 5 appears to have an easement which appears to travel into the neighbouring property next door. The numbering on the lane is also bizarre. It's obviously been sub divided at some point.

There is a small boundary alongside number 26 Forest Lane. 125 Forest Lane boundary line also has a kink in it. These could mean nothing. But in my Edwardstown research these sorts of boundary anomalies correlated with nearby underground easements.

It is also curious that there are buildings straddling the boundary between 243A and 245 View Street. There are other buildings that appear to straddle boundary lines along this area, which I assume has something to do with perspective. But the buildings between 243A and 245 seem to be *half* on each property. This is odd.



Multiple researchers have explained to me that palms are indicators for underground tunnels/bunkers. There seem to be a lot of palm trees in this particular location in Bendigo. There are more to the right of 243A.

I note that my childhood home on Macklin Street had a palm out the front, and there were two palms at the end of Macklin Street on the corner of Castle Street.



Manhole out the front of 243A – but again this looks pretty small.




This is the back of the property.



This very old house next door to the kindy on Forest Lane could be the origins of a cellar or rooms under the kindy property. I've had a look on the real estate websites and there is no floor plan given and there doesn't appear to be a cellar, though there is an enclosed space with a door in the kitchen which could be a door to a cellar.



This place next door to the kinder is dilapidated and might be an access point to the underground. There is no door.



There are Telstra access points, a manhole and a storm water drain/node at the Barnard end of View Street.





This house at 202 Barnard, on the corner of Barnard and View Street, has sheds at the back and a side yard that could have tunnel access.
